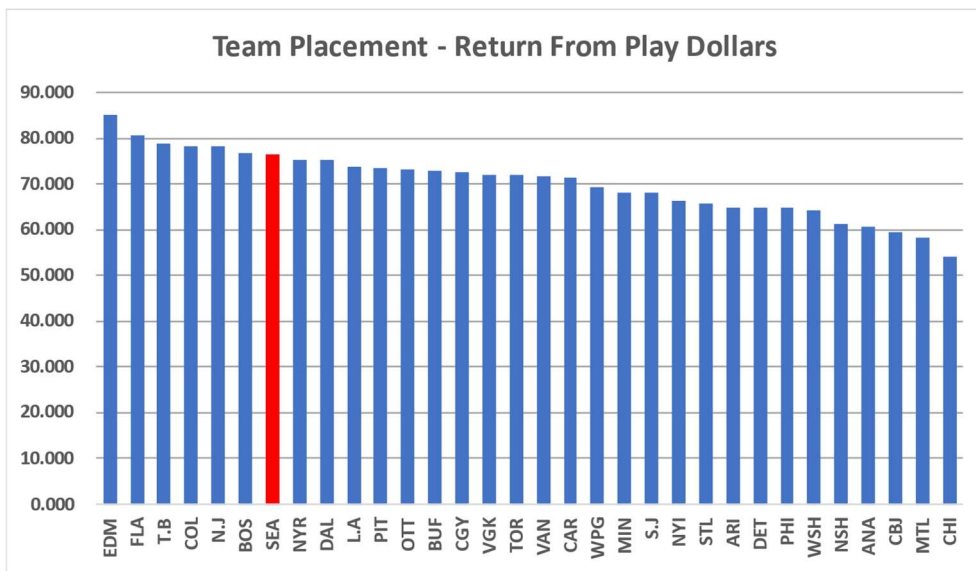

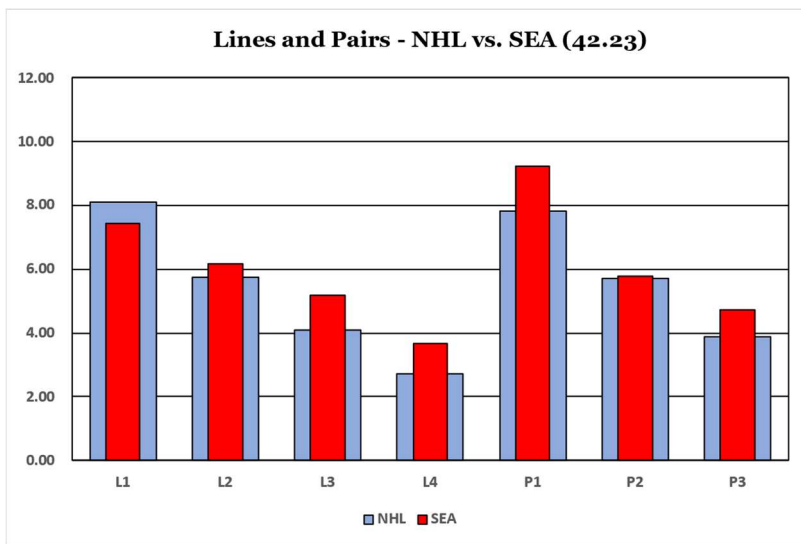

Team Essay – Three Goals in a Game

What was Seattle’s strength this season? Let’s look at forwards, defensemen and goalies, but in reverse order.

The goalies, Jones and Grubauer, were below league average, giving up about seventeen more goals than expected. The league average goalie had a 0.904 save percentage, while the Kraken average goalie’s save percentage was 0.890.

As can be seen in the Lines and Pairs chart, their defense is excellent. They have an outstanding first pair, an average second pair and an above average third pair.

The Lines and Pairs chart shows that their first-line forwards are below average, while their second-, third- and fourth-line skaters are all above average.

The difference between their first-line and third-line forwards was third smallest in the league, with only Montreal and Nashville having a closer set of nine forwards. But while Seattle put three second-lines on the ice, Montreal and Nashville put three third-lines on the ice, so they aren’t in the same class as Seattle.

Productivity Rating (PR) is used to assign players to lines. I calculated how many extra points Seattle got from their forward lines compared to the league average to see how their three second-lines helped them.

Seattle does well even when comparing them to teams with strong first lines. Ottawa, granted they are not a playoff team, had a strong first line. Seattle got more points from their fourth-line players than Ottawa got from their third- and fourth-line players combined.
